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Lower School: Reception, Years 1 and 2

Years 1 and 2

In Year 1 we have continued our art project with an interpretation of Monet's 'Water Lily Pond'. It was so wonderful to see the boys' take on a famous piece of art!

In our History topic of significant individuals, we learnt about Mary Seacole and the role she played in the nursing profession. In Geography, we designed and made a flood resistant house out of Lego. Our budding architects and engineers had to creatively design a house to protect it from the elements. We saw lots of quality collaborative work and problem solving.

In English, we concluded our 'Through the Magic Mirror' topic by comparing and contrasting things that took place in different locations of the story and completed a comprehension based on the text.

Our Maths topic has focused on subtraction and how to use a number line.

In Year 2 this week, we had a TPR lesson where we learnt what it means to belong to a group. We reflected upon how we 'belong' at Homefield in a range of capacities such as a class group, a House or a club.

In Science, we looked at how wax is waterproof and then created a piece of wax artwork using watercolours to illustrate this understanding. In our Geography topic of oceans, we created detailed collages of the sea which required lots of patience, determination and creativity.



In Drama, we continued with our rehearsals for the 'Not-So Creepy-Crawlies', which we are very excited to be performing after the half term break.






