
Lower School: Reception, Years 1 and 2

In Reception, we have been learning about 'People who help us' with a particular focus on the fire brigade. We know that we must call 999 in an emergency! We have spent lots of time with our small world fire station and even enjoyed looking at non-fiction books about firefighters. Alex in RS said, "The book taught me that firemen use a ladder." The boys enjoyed dressing up as firefighters and worked with their friends to put out pretend fires. The boys have also continued their topic of fireworks by making them in a range of resources such as playdough, k'nex and magnets. The boys also created beautiful firework pictures using glitter and sparkles. In STEAM, we used the Purple Mash program to create firework pictures on the board: the boys enjoyed creating a range of swirls and explosions using the different drawing techniques. In English, the boys have been writing words to describe fireworks such as 'loud' and 'bright', and even compared them to 'as loud as a lion', and 'as colourful as a rainbow'. In our Maths topic we have been learning number bonds up to 10 and comparing items to see which is 'taller', 'shorter' and 'longer'. We even compared our height in the classroom, going from the tallest to the smallest boy!

In Year 1, we have continued with our work on word classes with a focus on nouns. We are learning the difference between common and proper nouns, you can put the boys to the test when reading or out and about to identify which nouns are common and which are proper. Our English text has been 'King of the Classroom' and we have focused on sequencing the story. In maths, we have been learning how to use partitioning to add two, two-digit numbers together. We used manipulatives such as dienes to help us understand the value of each number. In geography, we have been learning about map symbols and compass points and used these skills to follow directions and find specific points on a map.



In art, we have had two-part projects, our first was to create a firework scene against the skyline of London, see the photo of Nolan's beautiful art work. We have also started making Diya clay pots to celebrate Diwali.



In Year 2, we have continued with our text of 'Masha and the Firebird' by completing our letters, thinking carefully about how we could use persuasive features to make our letters engaging for the audience to read. In maths, we have been looking at finding '10 more' and '10 less' of given numbers and looking at number patterns to help us solve these mentally. We applied these calculations to a range of word problems. In geography this week, we have been comparing the climate and animals found in the UK to that of other countries around the world. We had a particular focus on the countries Thailand and Canada. We also thought about the countries we were from or that we had travelled to, and how the climate compares to the climate in the UK. In PSHE, we have been exploring the difference between teasing and bullying and how we should strive to make others feel appreciated and cared for. Year 2 have really impressed everyone with their incredible buildings based around the Great Fire of London. We can see how much hard work, time, effort and energy was put into these over the half term holidays. We hope you enjoyed supporting your son making their buildings.

In history this week, we looked at historical sources and thought about reliable and unreliable sources when finding out about the Great Fire of London.

Year 2 boys have loved going swimming recently, we have **three** more weeks of swimming. **These are on the 14th, 21st and 28th November.**


Science Quiz Club


ISEB pre-testing at Homefield
