Letter from the Headmaster

Dear Parents

What a purposeful week we have had. Thank you for the great turn out on Monday, despite the epic rain, for our new parents/transition evening and the launch of our building plans. Thanks to our caterers CH&Co, for staying on to demonstrate some of the foods the boys are appreciating now. For those who missed the event, we sent out a cover letter, some illustrative plans and a set of FAQs regarding the building works set to start this Autumn. These works will significantly improve our estate to enhance the boys' quality of education and enjoyment.

This week, our Year 8 boys are braving the south coast on an outward-bound course, now that they have finished exam season. Our 13+ offer is the most popular it has been for the last 5 years, with around 30 boys coming up to our Year 7 next year. Why is this? I feel outcomes drive this, as in terms of offers from the most prestigious senior schools we see significantly more offers at 13+ than at 11+; for example, this year we now have 2 offers in hand from Eton, 6 from King's College, 4 from Hampton, 2 from Reigate Grammar School and 1 from Westminster. Other important factors include the leadership and personal development we offer for our boys in the upper school as well as the value for money. A common misconception remains around 'Common Entrance' at 13+. These days in the London area, this is really more of a leaver's certificate, an 'exit' not an 'entrance'...many senior schools do not rely on this exam any longer and now conduct their own assessments, making offers on that basis.

This week, Year 5 set out for field studies at Fishbourne Roman Villa and the Juniors provided a drama production for their parents, and for audiences from Robin Hood and Sutton High Schools. The performance was much appreciated. The heavy rains stopped our Senior Department sports day last week, but we have a reserve date for the 5th July to look forward to. Thanks for the response from parents around the safer road issues. I know some of you attended a local council meeting to try and lever support ... it worked, and so we now have the local ward councillors behind a consultation evening here at the School on the 8th July at 6.30pm.

It would be great to get some parental support and representation at this meeting. I'm sure we would all like some traffic calming or safety measures for the road outside to help keep the boys safe.

We are fully staffed for September, an unusually good position for a London school. A couple of long serving staff are coming up for retirement and so I'd like to mention them now: Mrs Payne, our very own 'mad scientist' has shared her unbridled enthusiasm with the boys for many years and I know her strong character has personally inspired many to go on to study science seriously (our new Head of Department, Ms Smith, leaves her post as Head of Science at The Mall School to come and join us).

In the Juniors, one of our trusty class teachers, Mrs Dawson, leaves us after joining Homefield in 1992 with a career break for 5 years from 2001 to 2006 following the birth of her twins. Many boys have benefitted from her care, giving them such a good start to learning.


