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## Lower School: Reception, Years 1 and 2

In Reception, the boys have impressed all the staff by settling in quickly and calmly to our new routine. The boys have experienced many firsts this week including visiting the library, taking part in PE and going to the music room for our music lessons. At lunch, boys have been learning how to line up, choose their option and use a knife, fork and spoon.

In the classroom, the boys have started phonics by learning the sounds; s, a, t and p, focusing on hearing these sounds in words and forming the letters correctly and they have been working hard on writing their names which is such an important skill to help independence. In maths, we've been comparing sizes and heights of objects and using mathematical vocabulary to explain such as bigger, smaller, tallest, shortest etc.



In Year 1 boys have been getting to know our new teachers, Mrs. Godly and Miss Rowe and our new Teaching Assistant Mrs. Harris. There have been a whole new set of routines to learn including how to change in and out of a shirt and tie for PE.

In English, the boys impressed their teachers by writing a detailed account of their summer holidays. It was great to see so many boys working independently on this task. In maths, we have started our topic of place value for two-digit numbers using dienes to support us.

In history, boys are now engrossed in our new topic of travel and transport and are currently comparing past and present systems. In science, boys have been using pictures of themselves as babies to compare and contrast how our bodies change over time. The staff had so much fun sharing their baby photos with the class!



In Year 2 we have settled straight back into routine with our new teachers, Mrs.

Johnson, Miss Lane and our new Teaching Assistant, Mrs. Votier. We've been lucky enough to have a few new boys join our year group and we've worked hard on helping them settle in and make friends.

In English, we have started our new text 'The Day the Crayons Quit' by Oliver Jeffers with a focus on persuasive writing. In maths, the boys have started our place value topic and we've been working hard to partition numbers using the 'part whole' method. In history, we have started our topic of 'The Great Fire of London', which has already sparked interest in our boys.

In STEAM, we learned about The Monument designed by Sir Christopher Wren and Dr Robert Hooke, we learned about its significance to 'The Great Fire of London'. We then spent some time recreating the tower using Lego. Alan in 2H already knows an impressive number of facts about the Great Fire, including when and where it started and the importance of Samuel Pepy's diary.
