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### **Dear Parents**

We have enjoyed a smooth term with little in the way of restriction or interruption due to Covid. It's been great to see community engagement move forward so much. The new parent assemblies have been well received and I feel it's something we should continue with. Last week, Year 6 equipped us all on how to cope if bullying should rear its ugly head. This week, Year 7 delighted us with a smorgasbord of learning from short stories to Chopin and volcanoes.

Engaging with learning, our latest English Progress Test results (marked externally) indicate that 44% of our whole school cohort are working at 'above' or 'very high' compared to the National Average expected levels. This compares favourably to the national average of 23%. We have been quick to identify and mitigate any 'gaps' through a bespoke post Covid recovery package through to the Spring Term. Where needed, tailored interventions for

handwriting, comprehension and spelling have been deployed.

The latest Math's Progress Test results have seen 55% of all pupils from Reception to Year 8 achieving 'above' or 'very high'. Again, nearly double the national expectations. As with English, our recovery planning here has focused on ensuring learning is fluid according to the topic and gaps from 'lockdown learning' are covered in depth.

With an eye on some fun amongst all this learning it was good to see so many of our Year 5 and 6 boys ace it in the 'National Junior Maths Challenge', where they won 72 medals. In the 'National Cipher Challenge', our Year 6, 7 and 8s, undeterred in competing against Sixth Form colleges, have been getting first and second places on the leader boards. It's an epic David vs Goliath moment for our young contenders. See page 4 for more details.

Looking forward, we will be sending out details and tickets for a range of festive concerts across the last two weeks of term. Please look out for that and we also have the Christmas Fair back, thanks to the Homefield Parents' and Friends' Association. Before all that, a few weeks of hard work for boys and teachers.

### Science

It has been yet another busy week in the science labs. Year 6 have been learning about the conservation of mass by heating magnesium in ceramic crucibles. The mass increases following heating due to oxygen being added to form magnesium oxide. The boys now understand that the mass of the reactants equals the mass of the products in a chemical reaction.



They have also just moved onto the circulatory system topic and are currently investigating pulse rate and how it links to fitness. The boys have had a go at listening to each other's heart rates using a stethoscope kindly lent to us by a Year 6 parent. There seem to be some budding young doctors at Homefield!

Year 7 have been delving into Plate Tectonics and were tasked with explaining plate boundaries. The boys used their design and technology skills, also with some amazing ICT talents to make model animations for tsunamis, volcanoes and destructive plate boundaries.





Year 5 have been learning about World Biomes; researching specific locations, creating shoebox models, and presenting David Attenborough style explorations to the class.



The boys have also been developing their World Map knowledge, OS map skills and beginning to explain and evaluate some of our environmental issues; they are very much abreast of the COP26 discussions, and all have an opinion! 


