#### Letter from the Headmaster

#### **Dear Parents**

Sincere thanks to the Homefield Association for hosting our most successful social event for some years. We had joyful support at the charity dinner event at Denbies Vineyard last Friday and raised £1,200 for the vital work of the Children's Trust in Tadworth. The event also helped us with fundraising toward our new Adventure Playground that starts construction in July thanks to the generosity of parents who have donated £23,000 to the project. Particular thanks go to Stephanie, Rhiannon, Yuzi, Kajal and the HA Committee for the organisation and commitment to enable this celebration. I was also surprised and happily overwhelmed by the speeches of thanks given to me. Deeply appreciated.

Thanks to your support, to the skills of staff and to the work ethic of our wonderful boys for another year of quite remarkable formal exam results. Let me share the very welcome headlines with you right now...

#### Year 8 Maths, English, Science:

73% gained grade A\* to A in English, Maths and Science

85% gained grade A\* to B in English, Maths and Science

#### Year 6 Maths:

98% of boys performing at or above the national standard 79% of boys performing highly above the national standard 50% of boys performing exceptionally above

the national standard

#### Year 6 English:

98% of boys performing at or above the national standard74% of boys performing highly above the national standard38% of boys performing exceptionally above the national standard

**In Year 1**, for the second consecutive year, 100% of our boys achieved the national expectation in Phonics at the end of Year 1, with 23% of boys attaining the highest possible score.

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#### Lower School: Reception, Years 1 and 2

In Reception, we have continued our topic of 'Moving Up' by reading the text, 'The Very Impatient Caterpillar'. We learnt about the caterpillar who found it difficult to be patient in his cocoon for two weeks and as a class we shared times that we find it difficult to be patient and suggested ways to help. We wrote a letter to the caterpillar to give him some ideas of what he could do to pass the time. Ishaan suggested he should "play monopoly!" The boys then enjoyed a test of patience themselves; they selected a small world butterfly which was frozen overnight in water. The boys then had to use a range of tools such as hammers, pipettes, paintbrushes, and chisels to get their butterfly out. Gryffin said, "I feel like a real scientist!" Freddie said, "I used my warm hands to melt the ice." The boys had a real sense of achievement when they finally got to their butterfly and were able to reflect upon how long the challenge took them. In Maths, we have been learning about symmetry and using butterfly wings as an example of symmetry in nature. The boys made a range of symmetrical pictures using gems, shapes, and natural objects.



In Year 1, we have continued with our poetry topic and learning strategies on how to read them. Evan impressed everyone with his brilliantly unique rhyming couplets!



In Maths, we have been working on a unit of work on time with a focus on 'quarter past' and 'quarter to' and comparing time durations. In TPR, we have been reflecting upon 'What makes me, me?' by thinking about things that might be different about us such as beliefs and opinions but also what we have in common. In History, we have been learning all about the dinosaurs.

In Year 2, the boys have finished writing their sequel to 'The Magic Finger' and we believe some of them may have given Roald Dahl a run for his money! The boys needed to include lots of complex writing features such as similes, interesting and varied sentence types, and adverbs. Rohan demonstrated all these features in his first paragraph which reads, "As quick as a flash, the girl was running to the Coopers with fury. Then, she wildly put the magic finger on them. In a few moments they turned into crabs as hard as rocks." Rohan said, "I found this *writing fun because I like writing."* In Maths we have started a new topic on position and direction and in Science we have recapped learning about food and energy chains. We are coming to the end of our history topic on the Gunpowder Plot and explored the chronology of events leading to the discovery of the plotters. The boys had to evaluate which events were the most significant in the discovery which led to some interesting discussions and debates. Lastly, the boys have taken part in a workshop with Polka Theatre this week which has focused on a range of PSHE topics including transition to Year 3.

Well done to all the Reception and Year 1 boys for a brilliant assembly based on the book 'You are Special'. The boys worked hard to learn their lines and songs. This story has a beautiful message for both children and adults, and we're so pleased with how the boys brought that message to life. We hope that they will always remember the message of the story that they are special for exactly who they are.



Here are some activities that have been taking place in the ever busy science department...



Year 6 had a fabulous day out at London Zoo looking at all the amazing animals. Krish Mohan summed up the day; 'London Zoo is the best place ever. Animals, from a bush baby all the way to an emerald tree boa snake were camouflaged amongst the trees. The zoo brought humanity closer to organisms and it was simply splendid to see real-life animals instead of just watching nature programmes. This exceptional expedition also merged our science work on evolution and adaptation with art and all of the interesting drawings that we do.' Year 3 enjoyed carrying out their paper helicopter experiment in the sunshine. They investigated whether larger or smaller paper helicopters fall the fastest, and then used their conclusion to link to plants and how they disperse their seeds.



Year 4 investigated which of a selection of foods contain the most energy by burning them and using the flame given off to heat a boiling tube containing water.
