Letter from the Headmaster

Dear Parents

Our attention focused on well-being, and 'finding our brave' realised some great outcomes. The staff set a good pace as role models, showing the boys how to express and share feelings and also when to 'dig deep' and be brave. From Mr Fitzgerald's Scottish poetry to Mr Meyers's juggling, we saw some big men who showed the boys that they are unafraid to take risks and perhaps even fail.

Sadly, in the wider world, our boys don't need to look far to be across less helpful models of 'toxic masculinity', especially in the media. Added to this worry is easy access children have to such. 'Childwise' published research this week finding that more than half of seven year olds now have a smart phone and that half of children are allowed to go bed with such a device.

A real worry. What's wrong with a teddy bear? You can give it love and it won't give you insomnia, cyber bullying, safeguarding and mental health issues... just lovely warm cuddles!

I digress, the main thing is we have been sharing a healthier take on life in the school, talking to the boys about when they have been nervous or afraid and how they stood up to that. Being a boy/young man and expressing your emotion, without fear, is part of what we should be teaching.

Here is a 'recipe' from Ismail in Year 4:

First, a cup of confidence with 25ml of belief Second, two spoons of strength and add a drop of laughter Next, mix a touch of grit, 50ml of determination Then pour a cup of enthusiasm with a litre of support After that, add a pinch of kindness with respect Finally mix it all together and then you have your jar of courage. ...and on good role models, a nod to one

...and on good role models, a nod to one of our Old Boys: Mr Simon Everest, who was awarded an OBE in the New Year's Honours. Simon went from Homefield to Dulwich and then onto a distinguished career in both the MoD and Civil Service. Luckily for us, Simon has now flown back to the learning nest and sits on our Board of Trustees.

We have lots of parents in this week in the Senior Department for teacher consultation. Thanks for your support with that. We also have a parent questionnaire open at the moment. The whole school started the week off with an assembly about what it takes to be brave and the boys watched a video of staff members retelling a time when they had to show courage. For Pre-Prep it was quite difficult to understand the meaning of 'brave', but the boys tried really hard and by the end of the week were much more knowledgeable. We focused on a different story each day and followed it with some lovely activities. We finished the week with 'Make1Change' and saw the boys coming in to school with different socks, trousers, tops or shoes on!

Junior Department

We have had a very busy couple of weeks and the boys gained a great deal from all the activities relating to our theme for Mental Health Week – 'Find your Brave'. 3H led the form assembly on Tuesday about 'being brave' and they spoke confidently and maturely to us all.

This Tuesday, we welcomed Celia from the NSPCC who gave an informative presentation to Year 1 and 2 boys about 'Speak out. Stay Safe with Buddy'. Celia was very impressed with the boys' listening skills and reflective responses. The Year 3 boys joined in the presentation given to the older boys in the Senior Department.

In Year 1, Eric's mother came to talk to the boys about Chinese New Year; she told the boys lots of interesting facts and we were amazed with the questions they asked. They also watched a video telling them about the story of the Chinese Zodiac. In Science, the Year 1 boys have been testing materials to see if they are waterproof. The boys all showed great enthusiasm for the activity but the Lego men used in the experiment weren't so impressed with their dunking!

Year 2 has been enjoying Dance as one of their Enrichment activities. They now use the assembly hall for this activity as it gives them greater scope. The boys have several favourite routines which they perform with gusto! They also partner with others to combine moves into unique routines. There are many budding dancers in our midst! This week, Mr Frost joined us for a few of our lessons and was extremely impressed at how well our Reception boys can talk about their feelings when changing their Mood Monsters, and then suggesting ways in which they can improve their mood.

The boys are doing well with practicing putting their hats, scarves and gloves on independently before play times. Keep encouraging the boys to do this by themselves at home, as it really helps improve their confidence and independence skills. When the weather is cold we do encourage them to put all their warm clothes on.

Another creative activity the boys have explored recently is Aboriginal Art. They have produced a variety of pictures in this style using pencils, crayons and paint. We are all delighted with the new displays in the classrooms.

This week in Science, Year 3 were investigating which teeth are most generally used to eat a variety of foods. The tasty treats: carrot, apple, bread and popcorn disappeared swiftly and the boys then recorded their personal findings into a class results table – and at this point, we moved away from the 'expected' results!!! Those with missing or only recently replaced incisors (about $\frac{2}{3}$ of the class apparently) choose to bite with canines and molars! Well done boys – we had fun!



During enrichment, 3H have been learning some playground games that they are looking forward to teaching the younger boys! So far they have enjoyed playing 'Rainbow' and 'Grumpy Frog'.

Year 4 began their rugby season with two exciting fixtures on the 16th and 23rd January. On the 16th every boy in the year group played as Ewell Castle and Reigate St. Mary's came to Sutton Cricket Club. Our 'A' team were dominant in the contact and proved too strong for Reigate St. Mary's 'A' team, winning 11-8 with tries from Tosin (3), Rayhaan (3), Oscar (2), Jake (2), and Malachi (1). Our 'B' team played Ewell Castle's 'A' team and despite showing great determination, they lost 8-14 with tries scored by Aidan (1), Noah (1), Dhilan (3) and Vir (3). Our 'C/D' team narrowly lost by two tries to Reigate St. Mary's 'B' team. The eight Homefield tries were scored by Aaron (2), Raece (2), Denis (1), Tobi (1), Vedanth (1) and the 'Man of the Match', Wilfred (1). The 'C/D' team won by two tries against Ewell Castle's 'B' team - an excellent 9-7 win with tries scored by Alex (2), Magsud (2), Siddharth (1), Rahul (1), Nikshep (1), Minghao (1) and Kavin (1). Ewell Castle's 'C' team played out a thrilling 8-8 draw in a tag rugby match against the Homefield Year 4 tag rugby team. Adharsh (1), Jeyavel (1), Iiham (2), Michael (2) and Captain Henry (2) were the try scorers in a very enjoyable match.

On 23rd January, our 'C/D' team travelled to Kingswood House and played two fantastic games of running rugby. In one match, 14 tries from Raece, four by Captain Shaan and one by 'Man of the Match' Luke, meant the game ended in an incredible 19-19 draw.
