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# Lower School: Reception, Years 1 and 2

#### Reception

This week in Reception, we have started our new topic of 'Owl Babies'. We enjoyed retelling the story with a particular focus on the use of the repetitive phrase, "I want my Mummy!" from the smallest of the owl babies, Bill. We discussed the worries that the baby owls had and how they tried to help themselves with their concerns. We then shared things that make us anxious and what we can do to reassure ourselves. Bertie said, "I was worried about my first day at school, but I reminded myself that my Mummy would come and get me at the end of the day!" Ariz shared, "Thunder makes me feel scared, I will close the curtains, so I feel safe."

In Mathematics, we have started to look at addition with the focus of understanding that addition is the combining of two groups to make a total amount. The Reception, boys amazed us with their fantastic knowledge of addition already! This week, we have learnt the sounds y, w, z and x (in that order) and sounded out and blended words with these sounds.



In Year 1 this week, our History topic has been learning about Guy Fawkes ahead of Bonfire Night: let's see if Year 1 can recall any of those facts ahead of the Bonfire Night at school next week! In STEAM, the boys have been introduced to the 'Leaders Award Competition' and what this entails. Our Art focus has been on decorating sea turtles using water colours. In English, we have started a new text, 'Supertato'. We have had a focus on common nouns and enjoyed doing a noun hunt around the classroom and in the text!

Year 2 have had a busy first week back! We have been continuing to work on addition and subtraction in Maths, working with bigger numbers. Our phonics groups are still going successfully and in English we have been working on diary entry features, linked to our class book 'The Explorer'. We have started our new History and Geography topics – 'Travel and Transport' and 'South America'. In Science, we have been discussing the life cycle of animals and humans!
