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## Lower School: Reception, Years 1 and 2

In Reception, our final focus text was 'Zog' by Julia Donaldson. It was a familiar text for so many of the boys who enjoyed finishing the rhyming sentences! In the story, Zog travels through dragon school learning a new lesson every year and working hard to win the golden star. We reflected upon our successes in Reception and thought about all we had learnt and achieved this year. We made ourselves a golden star and shared what we thought we had done to achieve it. We spent lots of time discussing the meaning of phrases such as "many moons ago" and "zig zagged through the blue". In Maths, we have used numicon to help us with problem solving. We matched numicon pieces to shapes and explained our reasoning. Arjun said, "3 matches the triangle because it has 3 sides and 3 corners!" We have also enjoyed exploring numbers in the water play outside. Gryffin made "number slushies" for the adults to enjoy!



In Year 1, we have continued our topic on time by learning how to tell the time to the nearest 5-minute intervals and converting analogue time to digital time. In English, we finished our topic of poetry by writing our own poems!

In art, we drew three minibeasts which we then cut out and arranged on a garden scene that we had drawn previously.



In Geography, we used Google maps to locate our school, once we had, we drew an ariel view of our classroom. See the photos for examples of our brilliant work. Our science topic of plants has concluded by learning about how plants pollinate and in history we have continued our topic of dinosaurs and the Mesozoic era.



In Year 2, we edited and published our 'Magic Finger' sequels, the boys are very excited to show you when the books return home next week. Alex said, "I think my parents will really like it because I've tried really hard to write it. My favourite bit of my story is the end where I've used lots of details and similes!" In Maths, the boys designed and made their own board games in which they consolidated the Maths units they have covered this year. Some of the Year 2 boys have also been rehearsing for the talent show this Friday. Zien, Shriyan and Harin are representing Year 2 on violin, piano and a poetry recital. Zien said, "I'm just feeling confident. I feel excited and nervous at the same time!"

On Wednesday, the whole of Lower School took part in a carousel of workshops during parent consultations. We had 'Love Theatre Arts' running a drama workshop, 'Techitots' running a workshop on coding and a Lego workshop organized by Mrs. Sharrad. The boys loved the range of activities on offer, and we heard positive feedback from the workshop providers about the engagement and enthusiasm the boys brought to the sessions. Bernardo said, "I liked acting as an animal in the drama workshop." Ariz M said, "In Techitots, I loved the robot Dash, he's called Dash because he's really fast, he has three wheels."
