
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#### **Dear Parents**

#### **Classical Studies**

A limited number of places are still available for the bi-annual trip for boys in Years 4-8 to Rome and the Bay of Naples for the duration of 14<sup>th</sup> – 19<sup>th</sup> July 2019. This is always a great experience for the students involved, and evaluation of previous visits has demonstrated that this undertaking, in addition to being a valuable life experience, significantly enhances the boys' knowledge and understanding of Classics.

Flying to Rome, we shall be visiting sites such as the Colosseum, Forum, Pantheon, Ostia Antica and Villa Adriana, before making the journey south to the Bay of Naples. There we shall visit sites including Pompeii, Herculaneum, Mount Vesuvius, Cumae and Oplontis.

#### Year 6 visit to Verulamium

On Tuesday, Year 6 visited the site of the Roman city of Verulamium, just to the south of modern St Albans. Once the third largest city of Roman Britannia and famous for being attacked during the Boudicca rebellion of AD60, Verulamium provides great insight into the daily life of people living in Roman times.

Upon arrival at the site our boys visited the remains of a Roman mansio (guest house), where the well-preserved mosaic floor and hypocaust beneath demonstrate the conveniences to be found in such establishments of the time. Our walk through the park then took in the surviving remnants of the city walls built originally in AD270, before we visited the remains of the theatre. At the theatre, our observant boys noticed how this particular structure was actually neither a true Roman theatre, nor a true Roman amphitheatre, but rather a blend of the two architecturally different structures in which both theatrical performances and gladiatorial/beast-fighting events could take place. After lunch in the park, our group divided; one half of our group explored the Roman museum and all the artefacts on show, which brought to life the lives of former occupants of the city in Roman times, whilst the other got involved in a workshop focused on the type of shops to be found in a Roman market and the goods which could be purchased therein. Overall, this was a very active day for our students with a great deal of material to enhance their knowledge of life in Roman Britannia.

## **Focus Fortnight**

In Year 5, we have set the boys a new challenge every fortnight and we call the challenge 'Focus Fortnight'. Our emphasis from next week will be to make sure that the boys' minds and bodies are ready for learning each day. We have been talking to the boys in their engineering and technology lessons about the importance of a balanced diet, therefore the 'Focus Fortnight' will be for them to bring in a healthy snack for morning break.

We are also watching and guiding them during lunchtimes, to ensure they have a more balanced lunch (based on the Eatwell plate). We are hoping that this focus will encourage healthy eating at every meal. By helping them start beneficial habits early in life, we hope to reduce potential health risks and increase their chances for longer, more productive lives.

Examples of healthy snacks for morning break can be:

- 100% fruit juice
- Fruit or vegetables
- Popcorn (minimal salt and butter)
- Dried fruit
- Low-fat yogurt
- String cheese
- Pretzels

In addition to this, we would like to encourage the boys to drink more water during the course of the day. Please can you place a pen level (or a sticker) on your son's water bottle to where you think he should drink up to; this is a clear indicator to how much he has drunk in the day. #### Year 4 Football Fixture

On Thursday 8th November, Homefield hosted Chinthurst and Hazelwood Schools for a triangular football fixture. Our 'A', 'B' and 'C' teams played their Chinthurst counterparts first and the Homefield 'C' team took a lead in to half time when Adam opened the scoring with a neat finish. In the second half, Homefield had to withstand heavy pressure for an equaliser and defended superbly with Leonardo making some great saves before Adam scored again to double the lead and secure a 2-0 win. Our 'B' team battled well against Chinthurst in a close, competitive match in which finishing was the difference; Chinthurst took their chances to win 2-0. The Homefield 'A' team went 1-0 down before Jake's perfect cross was headed home confidently by Rayyan. Homefield conceded a second goal before half time but increased the pressure in the second half and were rewarded for their improved pressing and possession when Tim's powerful shot from the right of the area nestled in the far corner to make the final score a fair and deserved 2-2 draw.

As Chinthurst did not field a 'D' team, the Homefield and Hazelwood 'D' teams enjoyed one longer match against each other. With a goal scored by Umar and a hat-trick by Tejas. Homefield finished as 4-0 winners after an excellent performance. Jonas was the 'Man of the Match' with some great passing and combative tackling in midfield. Homefield's 'A', 'B' and 'C' teams then played their second match of the afternoon, against Hazelwood.

The Hazelwood 'C' team were quick and skilful and took an early lead. However, Homefield levelled when lovely build up play ended with Hamdan scoring from a cross in to the area. Despite working hard in the tackle, the boys in black couldn't prevent Hazelwood scoring two more goals to win 3-1. Hazelwood also proved too strong for Homefield on the 'B' and 'A' team pitches - they ran out 4-0 winners in the 'B' team match. Across both 'B' team games, Andrew was Homefield's star player with excellent positional understanding and his passing was a threat for the opposition, while Aarush tackled strongly and Kai Tian and Rishan made good saves in goal.

The 'A' team again showed great spirit to come from behind after a good counter attack ended with Jake's deflected shot going past the Hazelwood goalkeeper to make the score 1-1, but a second for Hazelwood before half time and a penalty late on in the second half meant the match finished 3-1. The 'A' team benefited from Zak's defensive positioning and Alex's improved tackling and passing in midfield.

Well done to all Homefield Year 4 boys who represented the school.


